 - 7. Storage










- Maxing out at peak hours




Issues

3. Office: Non-basement




Issues

- Analysis suggests current need for 14,000 +/- asf of additional study space.
- Needs seem to be in stack, reading, and service
- Interviews reveal adequate library space
- Additional study space around campus should be considered



5. Special: Athletics, media, greenhouse





Issues:

- Fitness center, auxiliary gym, wrestling seem inadequate
- Locker room adjacencies
- Lack of multi-purpose rooms
- Lack of outdoor fields (Title 9)


- Distribution and quality are uneven

- Lack of campus "living rooms"













- Basement office space could be reallocated for storage space






Summary: Total Campus Space

Summary All Campus Space



- Opportunities to reallocate for better distribution, quality, and adjacencies
- Current surplus = 77,000 asf
- Future deficit = (7,000) asf

Summary: Total Campus Space without Bohannon



- Bohannon now has 20,000 asf of University space
- Not needed now but future will have (18,000 asf) deficit without it



Benchmarking: JCU Attributes

- One of the smallest Jesuit school: marketing opportunity
- Highest acceptance rate among both its Ohio and Jesuit peers
- Total classroom and office space is typical
- Lab space is generous
- Trails in athletics/ recreation, and student gathering space
- Fewest number of on-campus residents among both its Ohio and Jesuit peers.




Total space per student by type

- One of the highest in laboratory space




Ohio Peers: Total Student Body


National Peers: Total Student Body





Ohio Peers: Acceptance Rate




National Peers: Acceptance Rate







Issues

- Guidelines suggest minimum of 220 asf per bed.
- JCU at 189 asf per bed
- Only 3 residence halls have 220 asf per bed – Bernet, Campion, and Hamlin.
- Future needs assumes resident population increases from 50% to 60%.
